A Year In Review

The 2014-2015 academic year was incredibly successful for the Valparaiso University fraternity and sorority community. We welcomed the return of the Epsilon Beta Chapter of Pi Kappa Alpha while also welcoming the Valparaiso University Colony of Sigma Lambda Gamma National Sorority, Inc. The women of this group worked long and hard to achieve their goal of colony status through forming an interest group and petitioning to be recognized as an associate member of Panhellenic. As a community, we are ecstatic to continue the colonization process with these bright and determined men and women and to enrich our fraternity and sorority community with all that they bring.

The fraternity and sorority community welcomed more than 250 new members into the community during the fall and spring semesters. A few notable anniversaries happened this academic year with Phi Sigma Kappa celebrating 50 years of brotherhood in 2014 and Sigma Chi celebrating their 25th anniversary in April 2015. Sigma Chi has also joined Phi Kappa Psi and Sigma Phi Epsilon in reserving land for a future chapter facility on Union Street!

The fraternity community continues to lead men on campus in academics with an average 3.139 GPA, and the sorority community tops the all-women's average with a 3.331. The entire community also donated over 12,000 hours of community service and raised more than \$72,500 for local and national non-profit organizations. The inaugural Fraternity and Sorority Spring Service Trip was a success as 16 members participated with two staff members. The students and staff served at the Mid-South Food Bank and at Alpha Omega Veteran Services throughout the week, all while forging close bonds across affiliations.

Finally, plans have been finalized and furniture chosen for the new sorority housing facilities to be opened in 2016. The groundbreaking ceremony took place in March of 2015, and construction begins over the summer.



The future is bright for the Valparaiso University fraternity and sorority community and the past year provides us with a glimpse of what is to come. We are very excited to continue our growth and success in conjunction with Valparaiso University.

Valparaiso University Approves Sorority Housing Initiative



In July 2014, the Valparaiso University Board of Directors approved a plan to build six new sorority housing units on campus in the near future. Each of the new housing units would house 25 women from each sorority and include a chapter room and other chapter amenities.

In March 2015, the official groundbreaking ceremony took place involving Valparaiso University President Mark Heckler, Assistant Dean of Students Carrie Whittier, Panhellenic President Lauren Skiniotes, and the five sorority chapter presidents.

Construction on the new sorority facilities will begin in the summer of 2015 and is scheduled to be completed in 2016.

Pi Kappa Alpha Returns to Valparaiso University

The Valparaiso University fraternity and sorority community officially welcomed the Epsilon Beta colony of Pi Kappa Alpha (PIKE) back to campus in February 2015. At the "Meet the PIKES" night on February 25, 2015, the 50 new members of PIKE were introduced to over a hundred other members of the fraternity and sorority community, and they were welcomed with open arms.

The colonization process for PIKE continued through the spring semester with PIKE hosting events with Sigma Phi Epsilon and the Black Student Organization. Members of Pi Kappa Alpha participated in the annual St. Baldrick's event as well as many of the other fraternity and sorority philanthropy events.


Inaugural Fraternity & Sorority Spring Service Trip

The inaugural Fraternity and Sorority Life Spring Service Trip took place March 1-7, 2015 with 18 participants traveling to Memphis, TN with one mission in mind: serving others. The trip participants worked with the Mid-South Food Bank located in the heart of Memphis. There, the students sorted over 22,000 lbs. of food, packaged over 14,000 lbs. of food and sorted over 11,000 lbs. of rice, totaling 39,166 meals able to be distributed to the 300 local food pantries in need of food. The participants were then able to work with Alpha Omega Veteran Services Inc. to hear the stories of individuals who have risked their lives for our country.



While in Memphis, the group took a day to connect to the rich history of fraternity and sorority life by visiting the National Headquarters of three different organizations located in Memphis: Chi Omega, Kappa Delta, and Pi Kappa Alpha. Each organization provided a tour of the facilities, introduced the staff, and provided a brief introduction to the history of each organization. The group was also able to tour the campus of St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and visit the Civil Rights Museum. Overall, each student appreciated the opportunity to meet one another and make new friends, reconnect to history, and serve the Memphis community. Each member greatly enjoyed their time on the trip and is looking forward to what next years' service trip has in store!

Phi Kappa Psi Alumnus Receives National Award of Distinction



The North-American Interfraternity Conference (NIC) announced that Donald Fites of Phi Kappa Psi is a recipient of the 2015 Alumni Award of Distinction. The Alumni Award of Distinction recognizes a fraternity man who has given specifically of his time, talents, and service to the betterment of the fraternity. He is one of the best examples of lifelong membership that I have witnessed, and it is a true pleasure to work with him at Valparaiso University."

This year, we had a record number of qualified nominations and we are proud to honor these individuals and chapters for their accomplishments."


